 - a personal relationship with public significance
 - a commitment to seek the good of the other
 - a communion of persons
 - a call to love like God loves
 - to thoroughly give one's self to the other

From the Pastoral Letter *Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan*

- Each one of us is **called** to love like God

Sacrament of Christ's Love

From the Pastoral Letter *Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan*

- **What is sacrament?**
 - Outward sign
 - Instituted by Christ
 - Entrusted to the Church
 - To give grace
- **Marriage as**
 - a model of the Blessed Trinity
 - participation in the covenant between the Church and Christ
 - service of communion which means service directed towards others that contributes to one's own personal salvation
- **We are never alone as husband and wife – We have Jesus**
- **The love of Christ allows us**
 - to rise when we have fallen
 - to forgive one another
 - to bear each other's burdens
 - to love until the end

Forming Good Habits

Foundation of the Family and Society

From the Pastoral Letter *Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan*

- The family is the **foundational** way God gathers and forms us
- The domestic church rests on the foundation of a baptized husband and wife
 - Priest, Prophet, and King
- They pass on and share with one another the **essential teachings** on catechesis, prayer, morality, and service
- A husband and wife are **co-builders** of the foundation of all human society
- Married couples **reflect** the life of the Church in the world
- Sharing in the sacraments, especially the **Eucharist**, is so important

How can sharing in the sacraments really help my marriage and my family?

Sacramental couples live as communities that reveal God's blessings, reach out to heal the brokenness of the family and the world, and share their gifts with those around them.

Journey of Human and Spiritual Growth

From the Pastoral Letter *Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan*

- Marriage is a vocation, a call from God, a path to holiness, an imitation of Christ's self-giving love
- Spiritual growth is intertwined with human growth
- Growth of a marriage happens in stages, each of which have their own joys and sorrows, opportunities and challenges
- Couples grow in holiness when understanding the different stages in light of Christ's own journey
 - Paschal Mystery
 - Holy Thursday, times of loving service when couples put their own needs second
 - Good Friday, times of suffering, tragedy, and death
 - Holy Saturday, times of waiting and uncertainty
 - Easter Sunday, resurrection and new hope

Practicing virtues enables us to have a mindset that seeks to do the good. Foundational virtues in a marriage are faith, hope and charity. Faith in Jesus, hope that God is always there, and charity in mirroring the love of Christ

School of Love and Gratitude

From the Pastoral Letter *Marriage: Love and Life in the Divine Plan*

- **Marriage is**
 - leading each other to heaven
 - companionship & intimacy
 - mutual support & friendship
 - patience, humility and chastity
 - gratitude
 - Most often overlooked
 - Leaves someone feeling taken for granted
 - Growing in gratitude opens our heart to receive other gifts from God
 - The interior gratitude of a husband and wife is poured out in mutual gratitude to God for Jesus in the Eucharist
- My spouse is a gift whose "love source" is Jesus
